



What is a Sebaceous Hyperplasia? Sebaceous Hyperplasia are overactive or "overgrown" oil glands and appear as small pink-yellow-orange bumps, sometimes with a central indentation. They develop typically on the face as we age.

Do Sebaceous Hyperplasia need to be removed? These are completely harmless growths and have no cancerous potential. On occasion, removal is desired for cosmetic concerns. Removal is available at the Cosmetic Services Center (408) 851-8200 for a modest fee.
